### **Judicial Primary Election Candidates**

With the primary election coming up Tues., May 21, it is time to meet and learn about candidates. Often voters only vote for the top of the ticket, the offices and individuals that get the most media attention. Names at the bottom of the ticket, seeking positions like district and circuit court judges, go unnoticed.

On Thurs., April 25, the Lexington LWV sponsored a forum for Circuit Court Judge candidates vying for the seat formerly held by Judge Pamela Goodwine who moved up to the Court of Appeals.. The top two vote getters will move on to the Nov. election. Don't worry if you missed the forum. Simply go to www.lwvlexington.com, the League website and click on the link there to view the video of the entire event. You will be a better educated voter if you do. ## **Gubernatorial Debate**

A gubernatorial forum co-sponsored by the University of Kentucky Student Government Association, Gray Television (WKYT in Lexington, WAVE in Louisville, WXIX in Cincinnati, WYMT in Hazard, WBKO in Bowling Green, WSAZ in Huntington, WFIE in Evansville, KFVS in Cape Girardeau/Paducah, and WVLT in Knoxville) and the League of Women Voters of KY/Lexington is scheduled for Wednesday, May 15. Details are yet to be finalized because of the potential special legislative session.

It deals with voter suppression, the influence of corporate money, denial of voter access, unprotected and inefficient voting systems, the need to restore the Voting Rights Act and reforming our redistricting process.

It is not too late to add your voice. Call or write the offices of Sen. Mitch McConnell and Rand Paul. Tell them this is too important to ignore. The LWVUS makes it very easy to speak up. 

The Lexington LWV book club will meet **Tues.**, **May 21**, at 1:30 p.m. to discuss Bryan Stevenson's book *Just Mercy*. This volume presents the story of the Equal Justice Initiative, the people it represents and the importance of confronting injustice.

Mr. Stevenson is a widely acclaimed public interest lawyer who has dedicated his career to representing the poor, the incarcerated

and the condemned. He and his staff have won reversals, release or relief for over 125 wrongly condemned prisoners on death row.
