The Lexington League is sponsoring a Voter Guide using **VOTE411.org** again this year. This online guide is hosted by the national LWV and provides information to citizens across the country. Voters can access it at: **www.vote411.org**. With electronic system, you can see the races on your ballot, compare candidates' positions side-by-side, and print

out a "ballot" as a reminder to take with you to the polls on Election Day. This voter information site can be especially helpful for military and overseas voters.

Our local League is working to encourage more voters to register and vote in this year's elections. One of our target audiences is younger voters who get their news and information online. The **VOTE411.org** guide has several questions covering issues of importance to younger citizens.

League member **Lauren Wallace** is handling the technical issues involved in using **VOTE411.org**. Candidates must respond to an invitation to participate, verify their email addresses, receive the appropriate questions, complete their answers and submit them—all of this electronically. 
