Madeline McDowell Breckenridge **Attends New Member Social**

The Lexington League of Women Voters held a new member social on August, 25, 2019 at the Unitarian Universalist Church in Lexington. Approximately 45 people - prospective members, present members and community members watched a Kentucky Humanities Chautauqua presentation of the life of Kentucky Suffragist Madeline McDowell Breckinridge.

As acted by Kelly O'Connell Brengelman, the audience was enthralled by the life of Madeline Breckinridge who lectured, wrote and traveled on behalf of all women in the United States in helping to gain passage of the 19th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution in 1920. Following Ms. Brengelman's performance and questions from the audience, Sorello's gelato was served and the group socialized and learned more about the League's efforts in registering voters and educating the public on community issues.

Judy Johnson 1939-2019

As this edition of the VOTER was being put to bed, we learned of the death of our dear friend and League member, Judy Johnson on September 9. Judy served the Lexington League as editor of the *Lexington VOTER*, including helping with this edition. She also served as chair of the Essay Contest, member of the Board, chair of the KY LWV Felon Disenfranchisement Committee and volunteer extraordinaire—always willing to help when she was available. She will be missed.

Voter Registration Training

The League has been hosting voter registration trainings this year with more members ready to spring into action to register voters before the October 7th voter registration deadline. We piloted a 1 hour "Lunch Express" Voter Registration Training condensing the material from the usual 90 minute training into 60 minutes during the lunch hour, designed for people who are already familiar with voter registration and are also proficient with a computer.

One new volunteer is interested in registering voters on UK's and Transy's campuses, motivated by poor college student voter turnout. We have found there is some confusion among college students whether they should register in Lexington or in their hometown. Students are allowed to register to vote in either location: at their parent's address or their college address. There are advantages and disadvantages to both strategies. Students may be more familiar with elections in their hometown, however, it would require them to travel home on Election Day or to obtaining an absentee ballot. Traveling home could cause missed class or study time, and the process for requesting and obtaining an absentee ballot through the mail is a timely process. On the other hand, students may be less familiar with the local elections in Lexington, however, it would be very easy to vote locally, saving the time and potentially increasing voter turnout. The LWV is here to help students learn how to educate themselves about upcoming elections through Vote 411 and candidate forums.



Women's Equality Day Celebration Monday Aug 26

Mayor Linda Gorton and the Breaking the Bronze Ceiling Committee hosted a special celebration of Women's Equality Day by announcing the location of a new monument commemorating women and the passage of the 19th amendment to the Constitution in 1920, giving women the right to vote. The statue will be at the base of the Lexington Financial Center, or "big, blue building". The design will be chosen from the four finalist, and their ideas will be on display in September.

Breaking the Bronze Ceiling has raised a little less than \$250,000 of the \$500,000 needed for the sculpture.
