



Volunteers Make Voter Registration Happen!

Summer has been busy for members of the Lexington League of Women Voters. We have been attending various events in the community to provide voter registration and information for citizens. On **Saturday, Aug. 4**, we set up shop at the Tates Creek *Back to School Rally* at the Gainesway Community Center. We registered several voters and we spoke with others who are working towards their citizenship. We assured them that we would be at their naturalization ceremony in November to offer them voter registration on the day they officially become United States citizens!

On **Saturday, Aug. 11**, we sponsored a booth at the *Walk to Bridge the Gap to Success* event sponsored by the Arc of Kentucky. There we were able to help quite a few disabled citizens verify or update their voter registrations. We also made several community connections that will lead to other opportunities for speaking engagements and voter registration in the future.

On Thursday, **Aug. 16**, we set up our monthly booth at Connie Griffith Manor. At this senior residence we consistently get several new registrations. Residents are also interested in contacting their representatives and restoring ex-felon voting rights.



On **Monday, Aug. 27**, LWV volunteers gave out registration information at the Kentucky Theater prior to the showing of the movie "Suffragette," an event sponsored by the *Breaking the Bronze Ceiling* group. This group was formed to raise awareness and funds for monuments recognizing Kentucky women of historical significance. A Suffrage Choir entertained before the movie began. These women in period dresses will become quite a familiar sight in the area between now and August of 2020, the centennial anniversary of ratification of the 19th amendment to the Constitution, which gave women the right to vote.

LWV Tribute to Senator McCain

LWV President Chris Carson issued this statement on the passing of Sen. John McCain:

"Senator John McCain dedicated his life to serving the American people; first as a heroic naval pilot and later as a Congressman and U.S. Senator for more than thirty years.

"The League was proud to work with Senator McCain on his bipartisan campaign-finance reform efforts. The McCain-Feingold bill was a game-changer to limit political campaign contributions from corporations, unions, and wealthy donors. In the years before Super PACs dominated American elections, Senator McCain had the vision for how money influences our politics, taking the power away from American voters.

"As his party's nominee for president facing the first African American nominee by a major party, then-candidate McCain defended Barack Obama from racist attacks on the campaign trail. He famously rejected the racism and bigotry hurled at his opponent, and instead focused on issues and policy. It was a testament to his character and his commitment to American democracy and its values.

"Senator McCain was a hero, a statesman, and a political 'maverick' known for reaching across the aisle. He embodied what it means to serve. The League sends our condolences to the entire McCain family—a family itself the picture of diversity and inclusion—during this difficult time."

Women's Equality Day

On **Saturday, August 25**, the Louisville League of Women Voters served as a co-host for *Women's Equality Day* at the Frazier History Museum in downtown Louisville. Three women currently serving as university presidents, were keynote speakers who provided inspiration for the day:

- Tori Murden McClure, president of Spalding University, reminded the audience of the importance of Title IX, which focuses on the broad scope of education, not just athletics. It is critical in empowering women to enroll in graduate programs qualifying them to serve as professors, administrators and presidents!
- **Susan Donovan**, a first generation college graduate in her family, said it was an honor to be the first woman president at Bellarmine University.
- Neeli Bendapudi, the first woman and the first person of color to be named president of the University of Louisville, reminded us that it is difficult to become something you cannot see, and she is proud to be a role model for young women. She also told us that election day in India is call the "Festival of Voting," signifying the value of exercising the right to vote.

During the event, six women were recognized for their service as members of the Metro Council. Mayor Greg Fischer launched Louisville's 2020 Cenntenial Celebration and Frazier Museum director, Penny Peavler, announced plans for celebrating women over the next two years.
