### **KY League to Sponsor Two Candidate Forums for Governor**

The Kentucky League of Women Voters (LWV) will host two debates between Republican Matt Bevin and Democrat Andy Beshear in the race for governor.

**LEXINGTON:** Forum will be co-sponsored with the University of Kentucky Student Government Association and Gray Television and its nine stations covering Kentucky. WKYT's Bill Bryant and WAVE's Shannon Cogan will moderate. The debate will be held on Tuesday, Oct. 15 at the Singletary Center for the Arts, and will air live on WKYT at 7:00 p.m. Eastern time.

**LOUISVILLE:** Forum will be co-sponsored with WLKY, with news anchor Vicki Dortch as moderator. The debate will be held Saturday, Oct. 26 at the Cralle Theater on the Bellarmine University campus in Louisville, and will be aired live on WLKY at 800 p.m. Eastern time.

Kentucky League policy requires that general election candidates be invited to participate if they qualify to be on the ballot and have five percent or more recognition on nonpartisan statewide polls. Should other candidates meet that requirement, they would be invited to participate.

THE GENERAL ELECTION IS TUESDAY, NOV. 5.

### Lexington League Granted IRS 501© (3) Status

The Lexington LWV has received official notification that it is exempt from federal income tax as of June 29, 2019. Donors can deduct contributions they make and the League is qualified to receive tax deductible bequests or gifts. Our organization is classified as a public charity.

What that means for us is we no longer have to specify fund use as being General Fund (taxable) or Education Fund (nontaxable). Previously, it was often difficult to decide which which activities and other expenses should be paid for by which fund. Allowing all expenses to qualify as nontaxable makes it easier to function as an organization. It will significantly facilitate good recordkeeping, reporting and disclosure. We expect the KYLWV to follow this application process soon, making us more efficient at the state level.

## LWVUS Vocal in Opposition to President's Attacks on Members of Congress

The following is the July 18 statement from LWVUS President Chris Carson and CEO Virginia Kase:

"The racist rhetoric and attacks on Rep. Ilhan Omar and other female members of Congress are deplorable, they dishonor the office of the President, and frankly, they are un-American.

"The escalating hate and xenophobic tweets are a distraction from the real problems facing our democracy, designed to further divide the American people.

"We must not let these racist outcries distract us from the important work of building a more inclusive democracy.

"Our great country is made stronger by the diversity of the people living in the United States. There is more that unites us than divides us.

"These attacks are wrong, and we must call them what they are: blatantly xenophobic."
